## **DAY TWO**

## Sunday, 20 September 2020

#### **DUBLIN HIGHLIGHTS**



Set off with a local guide who will show you around Dublin. The city has been molded through the centuries by economic, political and artistic influences that has shaped its architecture. Stop at Trinity College to see the Book of Kells, an 8th century illuminated manuscript of the gospels and see the Old Library. Tour Guinness Storehouse to see exhibits on how this world-famous stout was first created and why it is so popular today. Finish your visit in the roof-top bar, where you can sample a draft of Guinness.

Next, head to County Wicklow and visit the 6th century monastic ruins of Glendalough. The visitor centre explains how St. Kevin founded this settlement at a time when Christianity was burgeoning throughout Ireland. After your visit, check into your hotel for dinner and overnight stay. (B, D)

### **KILMOKEA GARDENS & WEXFORD**



This morning, we head to New Ross and visit Dunbrody Emigrant Ship, a replica of a sailing vessel built in 1845. The visit will give you an insight as to what life on board ship was like as well as filling you in on the history of the famine years.

We continue our travels to Campile and visit the gardens at Kilmokea Gardens. The gardens are divided into two distinct parts. Around the house are the formal walled gardens and then behind a wooden door leads you to a charming lower garden with many rare plants.

Later on we visit the Hook Lighthouse, one of the oldest lighthouses in the world, and the oldest operating lighthouse in Ireland.

Final stop for the day is Wexford where we will stay overnight (B, D)

From Midleton, drive to Cobh, where you can enjoy some free time to explore this picturesque waterside town that was known as the last port of call for the ill-fated Titanic voyage in 1912.

Then make your way to Cork, Ireland's second largest city and check into your hotel. Once you settle into your room, join your fellow travelers for dinner. (B, D)
